

Mears Group announces 20 new apprenticeships in North Lanarkshire

Mears Group, in partnership with North Lanarkshire Council, is providing career opportunities to young people in the area with plans to take on 20 new apprentices in 2022.

The successful applicants will get the chance to learn a range of trades and skills while also starting their careers with Mears. Mears has been employing apprentices in North Lanarkshire since 2011, and in that time has taken on more than 170 apprentices in the area.

and working with companies including Mears to deliver apprenticeships in the area is a key part of this.
