The programme was launched to support young people from low income backgrounds who want to begin a career within the security industry. The aim is to help them develop a variety of transferable skills that will give them a head start in their career in the industry.

Starting in April 2022, the individuals will take part in one week of paid training, followed by up to a week of work experience, supported by 10 months of mentoring from a mentor that has been matched with them.

By undertaking employability skills based sessions and spending time working on real life projects the programme aims to widen their understanding of the working world, helping them gain real, valuable experience.

Ward has 5 mentors supporting the programme this year and it will be sponsoring 4 young people.
