A Mitie win

Throughout the year, [Mitie](#) – one of the UK's leading FM and professional services companies – was busy completing actions from the Green Impact programme's online toolkit and uploading evidence to demonstrate the measures its teams had taken.

Overall, the teams enacted 360 new measures, exceeding the target of 270 needed to attain the three gold awards. Their hard work paid off and the NUS auditing team verified the team's success.

Environmental Heroes

As well as winning the three gold awards, two Mitie colleagues were named as Environmental Heroes.

Karl Winder and Martin Moore were recognised for their incredible dedication and hard work in supporting

projects on sustainable theatre waste management and their commitment to continually spreading awareness about the importance of correct waste segregation on site.
