

<u>Utilities work in the pipeline for Bruton</u> <u>Knowles</u>

Bruton Knowles was selected following a competitive tender process and will be supporting Cadent to deliver consents, planning permissions and land rights across its Northwest England, West Midlands, East of England, and North London regions. The firm is also appointed to provide specialist valuation services across all regions.

Cadent is responsible for the safe and efficient transportation of gas in some of the UK's largest and most densely populated cities, such as London, Birmingham, and Manchester.



It recently launched its first <u>Social Impact Strategy</u> which set out how greener choices will ensure decarbonisation across the network as the switch to hydrogen is made.

With new <u>sustainable energy measures</u> having been announced in the <u>Queen's speech 2022</u>, this is timely, and shows the momentum towards a low carbon economy is gaining pace.
