Payroll Giving, allows employees to give a percentage of their salary towards a charity of their choice, it can be a national or local cause. The employee contribution is then matched by the employer.

[Emma](#) explains: "We launched Payroll Giving in 2015, it was a way to allow our guys to support a charity of their choice. The scheme has been a success with so many of our team using it. It's a great scheme, as the company matches your contribution doubling the final amount"

For 2021, the employees contributed a total of £6,000 and the company matched it, increasing the final amount to £12,000.
