A new report by the British Council for Offices (BCO) urges the property industry to 'retain, extend life, reduce impact' to futureproof the office sector

The British Council for Offices (BCO) has released a new report that provides circular economy guidance to the office sector in relation to new-build, refurbishment and fit-out. *Circular Economy in Offices* sets out how offices can be designed and constructed in order to eliminate waste and pollution, circulate products and materials and regenerate nature.

Richard Kauntze, Chief Executive of the BCO, said: "Everyone involved in creating, acquiring or occupying office space has the potential to make Britain more efficient and less wasteful by embracing, and advocating circular economy principles to meet both urgent and longer-term sustainability goals."

New research reveals UK businesses have nearly £59 billion worth of capital tied up in working assets and equipment they no longer need.

As pressure mounts to find new ways to reduce the cost of doing business, reuse specialist, <u>Ramco</u>, is urging businesses to contribute to the circular economy and find new homes for idle items – rather than



letting them go to waste.

The new data shows 67% of respondents – as many as 3.7 million UK businesses – admit they have good quality, working equipment they no longer need. The survey also revealed individual organisations could have an average of over £10k worth of assets sitting idle.
