

CIC Chief Executive awarded honorary Doctorate from UCEM

The Construction Industry Council (CIC) warmly congratulates its Chief Executive, Graham Watts OBE, on his award of an Honorary Doctorate by the University College of Estate Management (UCEM) at a ceremony in Reading Town Hall on Saturday, 2 December 2022.

UCEM awards Honorary degrees to individuals who have demonstrated significant achievement in their field and whose achievements are compatible with UCEM's mission and values. An Honorary Doctorate is a distinguished award that UCEM can grant annually to individuals for their transformational influence in their respective Built Environment or Education disciplines.
