


<u>Serco to deliver Air Traffic Control for</u> <u>another five years at Hawarden Airport</u>

Serco has been supporting Airbus's operations at Hawarden for 25 years, providing the ATC service, the installation and maintenance of the essential equipment required to operate the airport and ensuring all airport operations are conducted safely. Additionally, Serco oversees routine and unplanned maintenance and ensures the airport remains regulatory compliant.

Unique to Hawarden Airport is Airbus' production of aircraft wings for their A320, A321, A350 and A330 aircraft which are all delivered to their Final Assembly Line Toulouse on the Beluga transport fleet.
