

<u>Tilbury Douglas begins construction at</u> <u>Yeovil District Hospital's new Breast</u> <u>Cancer Unit</u>

The new unit will bring all the relevant services together, enabling patients to have their clinical examination, an ultrasound scan, a mammogram, a biopsy, a prosthesis fitting, an appointment with a doctor and an appointment with a specialist nurse all in one place.
