Eddie and Jane collaborated with their local Chambers of Commerce as part of the 'Learning to Work' programme and delivered engaging and interactive talks to the children at local schools about working in security.

The scope went far beyond talking about just security and included links to the curriculum, interview preparation, CV preparation, helping to building confidence in the children and sharing personal career journeys

Eddie and Jane used a series of show and tell materials and both left enthused with the level of engagement and interaction from the children.

This started conversations within G4S about scaling and formalising the programme and the 'Securing Futures' scheme was born. Staff across the country are encouraged to take part in the scheme, helping them to engage and be visible within their local communities.



Under the scheme, staff are provided with a series of support materials including photography and show and tell materials which they use to demonstrate the role of security within the context of the modern curriculum.
