

GPA appoints new COO to support transformation

Since launching in April 2018, the GPA has taken responsibility for nearly 1m sq. m of the Government's portfolio – managing and maintaining properties and acting as an expert partner to government departments on portfolio planning and workplace services including inclusive design, property technology, sustainability and workplace experience. This expertise has seen the GPA's Stephenson Street Office in



Birmingham awarded as the <u>best employee workplace experience in the UK's public sector</u>, and within the top 2 per cent of global workplaces.

The GPA is also delivering the Government Hubs Programme, where recent milestones have included starting construction on the First Street Hub in Manchester, and opening the GPA's fifth hub in Peterborough.
