

## North Tyneside Hospital Celebrates Milestone Achievement in Net Zero Project

<u>Dalkia UK</u> and Northumbria Healthcare NHS Trust have successfully completed a £22 million groundbreaking sustainability project. Focused on significant upgrades at North Tyneside Hospital, it aims to achieve Net Zero carbon emissions and was supported by funding from the Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme.

Starting onsite in October 2021, this ambitious two-year project is part of a focused plan by Northumbria Healthcare NHS Trust to reduce carbon emissions, aligning with the NHS & Northumbria's broader commitment to Net Zero by 2040. The project will reduce environmental impact, improve efficiency and strengthen the hospital's infrastructure.

The work included; installing large-scale heat pumps, a 1MW solar photovoltaic array, producing 300,000 kWh of electricity each year, the equivalent of powering over a hundred 2-3 bedroom homes. Along with a new electricity substation, safely demolishing a 38-metre high chimney and replacing 780 windows whilst ensuring the hospital continued to function and serve its patients, visitors and staff.

The work will improve comfort for staff and patients through enhanced insulation and energy-efficient measures and will generate a projected 75% reduction in  $CO_2$  emissions by 2030. It has created a substantial decrease in the hospital's carbon footprint and will save the trust approximately £500,000 per year in energy costs and reduce the chance of power outages, which would critically impact the hospital.

Jonathan Kershaw, Managing Director at Dalkia (Energy Services) said: "This project demonstrates technical innovation that delivers significant decarbonisation and the benefits of the great teamwork and collaboration that has existed between Northumbria Healthcare Facilities Management, the Trust and



Dalkia. I am grateful to the teams for all their hard work that has helped us get to this point. Dalkia are looking forward to working with the Trust on the next stages of their Net Zero journey ."
