

PTSG shores up Welsh church

Criccieth is located in Eifionydd on the Cardigan Bay shore of the Llŷn Peninsula. The town is a seaside resort, popular with families. As the spectacular photograph shows, engineers from PTSG Electrical Services Ltd installed a new air terminal on the Ty Criccieth church, which is situated on the high street that runs through the town.

An air terminal, also known as a lightning rod, or finial, is a pointed tip rod made from conductive material such as copper or aluminium and is positioned above all other metallic objects on a building or structure to provide external protection from direct lightning strikes. Air Terminals are the metaphorical tip of the iceberg in a lightning protection system.
