

Three new divisional heads announced at leading property consultancy

Three new heads of division have been appointed at a leading property consultancy as it makes a raft of promotions across the business.

"With the way demand is going and the likely increase in the size of the team at Fisher German, having one person overseeing the whole operation was going to be untenable.

"George and I working together will enable Fisher German to be at the forefront of this unprecedented increase in infrastructure work, and the eight promotions within our infrastructure team show we want our talented colleagues to be right there with us at this exciting time."
