The <u>Association for Specialist Fire Protection (ASFP)</u> hosted the official opening of its office and training Academy on Wednesday 15th May.

ASFP staff, members, and guests were joined by Lord Mayor of Coventry Cllr Jaswant Singh Birdi, and Lady Mayoress Krishna, who marked the official opening with a ribbon-cutting ceremony and a plaque installed to commemorate their visit.
