

<u>Cushman & Wakefield Signs For New West</u> <u>End Office At Derwent London's 25 Baker</u> <u>Street</u>

Cushman & Wakefield has exchanged contracts on new office accommodation at 25 Baker Street, London, a brand new, Derwent London development. Baker Street will replace Portman Square as Cushman & Wakefield's West End office from September 2025.

25 Baker Street will offer next-generation office space with a shared roof-top terrace and sky room and top-quality end of journey facilities. Once complete, it will be a net zero carbon building targeting BREEAM Outstanding, LEED Gold, and an EPC Rating of 'A'. The building will also have direct access to a new pedestrianised public courtyard with cafés and restaurants.

Cushman & Wakefield's <u>Project & Development Services</u> and Workplace teams will be handling the fit out of the office to create an exceptional space for colleagues and clients. The new accommodation is situated a short distance from Portman Square, retaining the convenience, connectivity and amenities that Cushman & Wakefield colleagues and clients currently enjoy.
