

Atlas conquers the Yorkshire 3 Peaks for charity

Starting early with the sunrise before 5am, the team hiked up and down Whernside, Ingleborough and Pen-y-Ghent fells in a circular route. They braved windy conditions and the odd loose sheep to complete the challenge successfully. Numerous blisters and some tired legs did not stop the team from enjoying a celebratory drink together at the end of the 24.5-mile challenge.

The charity initiative is part of Atlas' expanding ESG efforts, which have also seen the company clean up beaches in Bournemouth, remove trash from the Thames, and donate tens of thousands of pounds to pay for early years teaching apprenticeships.
