


PTSG completes project at Trinity House, Glasgow

<u>Premier Technical Services Group Ltd (PTSG)</u>, via constituent business NSS, has completed a specialist structural services project at Trinity House, Glasgow.

The building was designed by the Architect Charles Wilson and constructed in 1856 for use as a training college for ministers of the Free Church of Scotland. It was a multi-disciplinary institution of considerable reputation, existing outside the University of Glasgow's Faculty of Divinity.

On 2 November 2006, Trinity College celebrated its 150th anniversary with a gathering of some 250 alumni and friends. Its 155th anniversary celebrations took place on 4 November 2011.

In this project, specialists from <u>PTSG Building Access Specialists Ltd</u> assisted with a roof and structural survey of Trinity House and its 50-metre-high tower. They used a 70m Bronto XR with operator to allow hands-on inspection of the roof and the tower.
