

Wates secures Hampshire & Isle of Wight blue light contract

<u>Wates</u> has been appointed by Hampshire and Isle of Wight's Fire & Rescue Service and Police & Crime Commissioner to deliver a four-year facilities management (FM) contract across approximately 150 sites.

The new £1.6m contract will see Wates deliver statutory mechanical and electrical compliance and preventative maintenance services as well as a range of reactive and project works for 61 fire stations and 93 police locations.

The new contract will span four years with an optional four-year extension and adds to Wates' current portfolio of blue light projects across the UK, which currently includes a range of fire station fit-outs and refurbishments on behalf of Cheshire East Fire & Rescue Service.

As part of Wates' continued drive to decarbonise the built environment, the team will also work closely with Hampshire and Isle of Wight's Fire & Rescue Service and Police & Crime Commissioner to identify opportunities to enhance operational efficiency across its sites.
