Ventilation maintenance and fire safety specialist [Duct Hygiene Ltd](#) has been acquired by [First Compliance Group](#).

The Wrexham-headquartered business, which also has bases in Birmingham, Liverpool, Preston, Manchester, Leeds and Middlesbrough, now becomes part of First Compliance Group, a compliance, training and regulatory safety specialist within the ventilation and specialist cleaning sectors.
