The 2024 AIG Women's Open was played from 22 to 25 August at the Old Course at St Andrews in St Andrews, Scotland. It was the 48th Women's British Open, the 24th as a major championship on the LPGA Tour, and the fifth championship held under a sponsorship agreement with AIG. It was the third Women's British Open to be hosted at St Andrews. Lydia Ko was the champion.

NSS Hire provided the necessary access equipment to enable broadcasters to capture competitive play so that fans around the world could enjoy a range of great pictures throughout the tournament.

The 2024 AIG Women's Open is the latest in a long line of high-profile events for which NSS Hire has provided specialist access equipment.
