The MOD's Defence Infrastructure Organisation awarded the design and construction contract to Tilbury



Douglas, which includes a substantial commitment to social value. Subcontractors from within a 50-mile radius of Catterick are being prioritised for the work to support local business and veterans.

Speaking at the event, Paul Ellenor, Regional Director – North East at Tilbury Douglas, said: "The topping out ceremony is a testament to the hard work and dedication of everyone involved in this project. This milestone brings us one step closer to delivering a world-class healthcare facility that will serve the needs of both the military and the local community for years to come."
