BM launched its Pearfect enhanced benefits package earlier this year. Team members now get 24 weeks of fully paid maternity leave and four weeks of secondary carer leave, as well as three days of grandparent leave, all of which extend to families welcoming new members through adoption and surrogacy.

The company is also offering four weeks of fully paid leave for periods of fertility treatment. This is in addition to BM team members already being able to take advantage of paid leave for their wedding/commitment day and birthday, one day a year for volunteering, and free meals during working hours. Wellbeing perks include an annual health check, and six mental health consultations, six nutritional consultations, six bereavement consultations and two digital GP sessions per year for them or their immediate family.
