

ISS partners with Biffa and Community Shop to help people back into work

[ISS](#), a leading workplace experience and facility management (FM) company, has helped its first group of members back into employment in Liverpool through a pilot partnership with social enterprise, Community Shop and Biffa, the UK leader in sustainable waste management.

Through the pilot, members from Biffa's award-winning social enterprise Community Shop can apply for employment opportunities with ISS, being fast tracked to the interview process. ISS provide a range of jobs from cleaning and food services to project management and commercial positions. The first four Community Shop members have secured cleaning roles at a local hospital in Halton, Liverpool.

Community Shop is an award-winning network of 13 social supermarkets, and forms part of Company Shop Group, the UK's leading redistributor of surplus products, which was acquired by Biffa in 2021. Community Shop supports some of the most deprived areas of UK, providing its members with vital access to deeply discounted surplus food and essentials as well as life-changing learning and development programmes.

As part of the development programmes on offer, Community Shop runs Progress Academy, which is divided up into two parts – pre-employment training and employment. Pre-employment training enables members to gain new skills, qualifications and confidence to re-enter the workplace in partnership with Complete Skills Solutions. Within this pilot, ISS then facilitates the employment part of the Progress Academy, which supports members back into work.

This latest announcement strengthens the partnership between ISS and Biffa, supporting Biffa's commitment to investing in communities and ensuring it is bringing opportunities to the areas where it operates. It also further builds on the three-year relationship between Biffa and ISS — where the Group has

used its expertise to create a circular solution, between a single supply chain.

Steve Jones, Head of Employability at ISS UK & Ireland, said: "At ISS, we're committed to delivering social value for our people and communities, so we're delighted to be partnering with Biffa to help people back into work across the UK. This initiative is an excellent example of what good can be achieved through collaboration, local partnerships with Jobcentre Plus and training providers and a desire to make a difference. Our inclusive recruitment approach focusses on working with partners to help people furthest from employment into careers that offer them opportunity and the chance to develop and grow."
