

Bidvest Noonan achieves an impressive 12% emissions reduction

<u>Bidvest Noonan</u> has reduced its carbon footprint by almost 12% in its fiscal year 2024, with these figures externally verified. The company is now ahead of its target of achieving a 42% reduction in emissions by 2030 and progressing towards becoming a net-zero business.

The almost 12% reduction in emissions was achieved through targeted operational improvements, with the company's procurement team playing a key role in driving sustainable sourcing and supplier engagement, including accelerating the company's transition to electric vehicles and working hand in hand with customers and suppliers on sustainability.
