

Serco's aquatics approved training centre achieves CIMSPA highest grade

In its first year of operation, Serco's ATC trained around 230 new swimming teachers, while in 2024 that number had grown to over 700. The centre runs on average around 70 courses per year to meet the demand for new swimming teachers.
