

Harmony Fire appointed to c.£25 million Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea fire safety framework

Harmony Fire has secured a place on a c.£25 million fire safety works framework with the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea (RBKC). The four-year capital works framework, with the option to extend for a further two-year period, encompasses a comprehensive range of fire safety works across RBKC's residential property portfolio.

The scope of works to be delivered under the new framework includes planned maintenance, refurbishment and improvement works, with Harmony Fire successfully appointed across the Active Fire Protection Systems; and Means of Escape, Fire Detection and Smoke Ventilation lots. Work streams for the national fire safety specialist will include the supply, installation, repair and maintenance of fire stopping, fire compartmentation and fire doors, as well as fire detection and smoke ventilation systems.
