Veolia Cares programme

The "Veolia Cares" programme aims to guarantee a common base level of social protection for the Group's 213,000 employees, even in countries where there are no such legal requirements. Unprecedented in terms of its scope and scale, it gives each Group employee access to parental leave, health and death cover, support for carers, and the opportunity to dedicate one day a year to a charity or an environmental protection project.
