

Colliers Bursary Recipient Wins Women in Property Award

A WCCS (Worshipful Company of Chartered Surveyors) bursary student supported by [Colliers](#), the global commercial property company, has been recognised at the 2025 Women in Property South East regional awards.

Mary Melindji, a Quantity Surveying student at the School of the Built Environment, University of Reading, was named one of six successful regional nominees at the event, which was hosted by Forvis Mazars and celebrates the best built environment students across the South East.

Mary has received support from Colliers through the Pathways to Property initiative and the WCCS Bursary, which is managed by the Worshipful Company of Chartered Surveyors. The programme provides both financial support and industry mentoring to help students progress in their property careers. Mary also completed work experience with Colliers as part of the course.
