To mark the occasion, VIVID came together with Ashley and leaders from Eastleigh Borough Council.

Out of the 10,000 new homes, over 80% are affordable tenures. These homes reflect a strong commitment

to giving people across communities more choice, greater stability, and the security of a place they can truly call their own.

Recently ranked sixth biggest builder amongst housing associations in England, VIVID is sustaining its commitment to developing more homes aiming for 1,600 over the next year.
