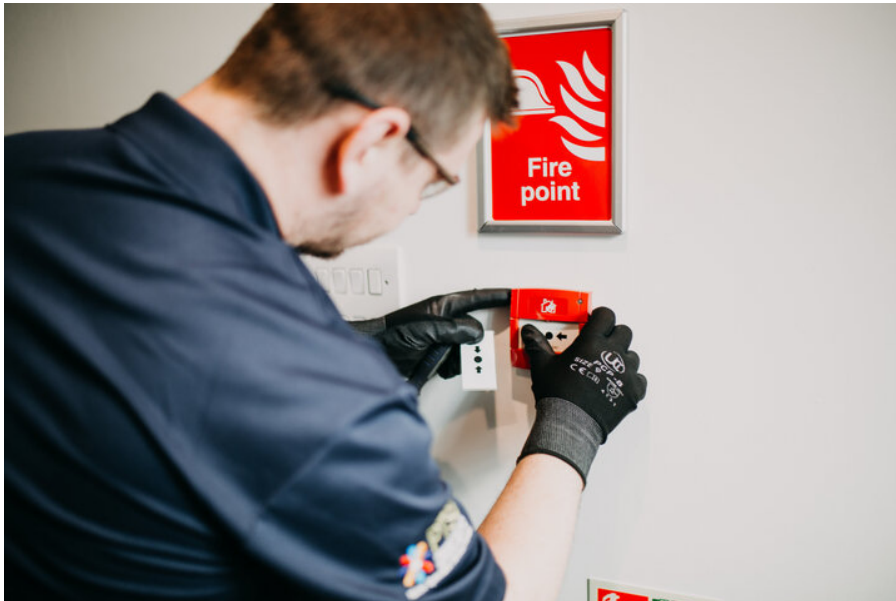


PTSG Launches Independent Fire Risk Assessment Service to Bolster Compliance Nationwide
