

Atlas Education up for national awards with Bath and Glamorgan schools

Royal High Bath is part of the Girls’ Day School Trust. Founded in 1865, it is an independent day and boarding school for girls aged 3-18 years and is located in the city of Bath, South West England. Royal High Bath has a storied history, as Florence Nightingale was instrumental in the foundation of the original school and Queen Victoria made a personal donation to help establish it.

Ysgol Y Deri, in the Vale of Glamorgan, Wales, is the UK’s largest Special Educational Needs (SEN) school. It caters for students aged 3-19 years with a range of learning and physical needs and autism. The school is featured in the BBC’s television programme ‘A Special School’, a programme that has won one Royal

Television Society Cymru prize and has been nominated for two BAFTA Cymru Awards. The BBC calls Ysgol y Deri “an extraordinary school for extraordinary people”.
