

Ground-breaking Counter-Terrorism Qualification Launched to Meet Martyn's Law Demands

A new professional standard for public safety has arrived with the official launch of the Level 3 Award in Counter-Terrorism Protective Security and Preparedness. Developed by [SFJ Awards](#), this is the first and only qualification to receive formal endorsement from Counter-Terrorism Policing (CTP) and the National Counter Terrorism Security Office (NaCTSO).

The launch comes at a critical juncture for UK businesses. Following the enactment of the Terrorism (Protection of Premises) Act 2025, commonly referred to as Martyn's Law, organisations across the retail, hospitality, leisure, and transport sectors now face mandatory requirements to enhance their readiness against potential threats.

While the new legislation mandates organisational compliance, experts argue that true resilience starts with individual capability. This Level 3 Award is designed to move businesses beyond "tick-box" compliance by providing staff with a credible, practical foundation in risk assessment and incident planning.

"Protecting people and places is no longer a specialist concern reserved for a small number of roles," the awarding body stated. "Preparedness has become a professional standard."

- Analysing UK threat levels and various terrorist attack methodologies.
- Navigating the legal requirements of Martyn's Law.

- Designing robust preparedness plans and evidence-based risk assessments.

The assessment process mirrors real-world challenges, utilising a mix of written assignments, professional discussions, and examinations to ensure learners can apply their knowledge under pressure.
