Churchill Group has been awarded the President's Award from the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (RoSPA) for its health and safety performance. The accolade is a recognition of ten consecutive Gold Awards.

2026 marks the 70th anniversary of the RoSPA Awards, which began as a small event to recognise the achievements of companies prioritising the safety of workers in the UK.
